








Introduction

Job description

Main purpose of the role:

The role is a fixed-term engagement, working alongside members of the Academic Applications team, to develop various web-based projects related to the institutional Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) - Blackboard.

Key responsibilities:

Software Developer

- Management and development of our institutional VLE (Blackboard), including development of LTI integrations.
- *Maintaining the User Experience (e.g. theme, localisation) and accessibility (A11y) of the application.*
- Developing, testing and maintaining a web-based applications using PHP, JavaScript, CSS & HTML.
- Working with the Team Lead, Project Lead and Development Manager to inform strategic development decisions.
- Ensuring that technical documentation is created and maintained to a high standard.
- Ensuring that application development complies with recommended security practices and the coding is performed in a security and privacy conscious manner.
- *Maintaining an up-to-date knowledge of technologies and recommended practice within the domain.*

Candidate background

We are seeking an experienced Software Developer to join the Academic Applications Development Team.

You should be educated to degree level (or equivalent qualification) or have considerable equivalent experience. You should have practical experience working as a Software Developer producing Web Applications in Object-Oriented PHP 5.6+ and the range of related technologies including, but not limited to, HTML5, CSS3 (including Sass), SQL and JavaScript (jQuery and Vue.js or similar).

Knowledge and interest in Virtual Learning Environments is vital and a familiarity with Blackboard is preferred. Expertise in developing LTI integrations would be a significant advantage.

You should have a strong software development background, including familiarity with the full development lifecycle. Practical experience of test-driven development is useful, as is an awareness of agile methodologies, ideally Scrum.

You should possess good analytical skills and the ability to confidently interact with a broad range of people. Excellent communication skills, both verbal and written, are a requirement alongside strong organisational skills.

Terms of appointment

Salary will be at the appropriate point on the Grade 6 salary scale and negotiable with placement according to qualifications and experience.

Any appointment will be made subject to satisfactory references and a 12 month probation period.
