Introduction



As a result of a wide-ranging review and a recommitment to the discipline, History of Art at the University of Aberdeen is looking to grow its strengths and extend its provision with a number of hires over the coming academic year.

The discipline currently has a core interest in the modern and Medieval with specialism in Scottish Art, and visual and print cultures. It has a single honours programme and a number of joint honours programmes at undergraduate level, plus an MLitt in Art and Business. The discipline has an impressive research profile with a particularly strong impact profile and significant external grant capture. There is significant scope for interdisciplinary expansion with History, Anthropology and Museum Studies, Philosophy and the Medical Humanities.

The University houses a diverse and high-quality collection spanning late Antiquity to the 19th Century which includes rare archaeological objects, medieval manuscripts and art collections. This collection provides pivotal opportunities for using artefacts to forge new academic and civic partnerships. In addition, the University's new Qatar Campus provides opportunities for developing international networks and initiatives.

- Develop strong networks within the School, University and wider academic and nonacademic communities.

With a population of approximately 230,000, the city stands between the Rivers Dee and Don. The Grampian Region which took its name from the Grampian Mountains has a population of approximately 545,000. It is made up of five districts – Aberdeen, Banff & Buchan, Gordon, Kincardine & Deeside and Moray. The city and the surrounding countryside provide a variety of urban, sea-side and country pursuits. Aberdeen has first class amenities including His Majesty's Theatre, Music Hall, Art Gallery, the Aberdeen Exhibition Centre, Museums, and Beach Leisure centre. Within a short time, beach pursuits, equine activities, salmon, trout and sea fishing, hill-walking, mountaineering, golf, sailing, surfing and windsurfing can be reached. The city and the surrounding countryside are repeatedly given high ratings for quality of life in surveys.

Aberdeenshire is one of Scotland's most appealing regions. Royal Deeside and the Cairngorms National Park are within easy access of the city, and there are a variety of towns and villages scattered along the coastline.
